- 1. In this series, it seems that every story or parable has a "SURPRISE," or a twist ending, reminding us that things are not always as they SEEM.
- 2. We understand again that God's view of most EVERYTHING is quite different than MAN'S perspective.

To the Pharisees (as the disciples listen in) (20-25)

Do not be preoccupied with watching for SIGNS because the Kingdom of God is ALREADY HERE ("in your midst").

The word order in Greek: "the Kingdom of God in your midst is

To the Disciples (as the Pharisees listen in) (26-37)

Do not be DECEIVED as you wait: when the Son of Man returns it will be SUDDEN and UNMISTAKABLE.

"The Son of Man in his day will be like lightning, which flashes and lights up the sky from one end to the other" (24)

"Where there is a dead body, there the vultures will gather" (37)

Do not be PREOCCUPIED with daily stuff: when the Son of Man suddenly returns your PRIORITIES will be REVEALED.

Noah: "People were eating and drinking...then the flood came..." (27)

Lot: "People were eating and drinking...then fire and sulfur rained down..." (28-29)

Lot's wife: "Remember Lot's wife!" (32)

If the Kingdom of God really is "in our midst," what should be our point of view about the daily stuff?


