Luke 22:63 The men who were guarding Jesus began mocking and beating him. 64 They blindfolded him and demanded, "Prophecy! Who hit you?" 65 And they said many other insulting things to him.

Jesus answered, "If I tell you, you will not believe me, 68 and if I asked you, you would not answer.
