The Five Pillars
1. The <i>shahada</i>
"There is no god but Allah and Muhammad is his prophet."
The Shema - Deuteronomy 6:4 Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one.
2. Prayer - <i>salat</i>

- 3. Giving Alms (charity) zakat 2 1/2% of one's income.
- 4. Fasting *siyam* During the month of Ramadan (celebrates the first revelation of the Quran)

5. Pilgrimage - hajj - a journey to Mecca in one's lifetime.

The Five Doctrines

- 1. Allah is omnipotent, omniscient, and practically unknowable because he is so transcendent.
- 2. Allah has sent many prophets 28 are recorded in the Quran.
- 3. The Quran is as eternal as Allah, but three other books are seen as being inspired. They are the Tauret (Pentateuch), the Zabur (Psalms), and the Injil (the Gospel) of Jesus.
- 4. Jinn are both angels and fallen angels. The ruler of the Jinn is Shaitan (Satan).
- 5. There is coming a day of judgment, a resurrection, and an eternity of heaven and hell.
